Dear Parent / Carer,

I very much hope that you, your family and friends have been well throughout this unprecedented period.

You will have heard in the news that the Government wants schools to re-open for a phased return of pupils from Monday  $1^{st}$  June. Dependent on the country meeting the five tests to lift lockdown, this phase will be for children in Year 6, Year 1, Reception and Nursery. Pupils from other year groups who qualified for childcare during closure are also eligible. The Government would like <u>all</u> pupils to return to school 'a month before the end of the school year' on  $22^{nd}$  June for phase 2.

I am writing to share an overview of our planning / arrangements for phase 1 with you. These have been informed by Government advice and our knowledge of the school. I will of course be providing you with more detail in the coming weeks.

Whilst we are desperate for the children to return, the safety of our school community will remain central to all decision making about the school's re-opening.
