



HTSTORY

During this unit, Year 4 will explore one of the earliest civilisations of Ancient Egypt. They will learn about how we have used artefacts to tell us about life in Ancient Egypt. They will study the creation of the pyramids and why pharachs were buried there. The children will look at Egyptian beliefs and mythology which permeated Egypt at the time.
