


Timeline

Word - Greeks	Definition
invade	An armed force entering a country so to occupy it.
rationing	Whereby a person has only a fixed amount of something.
prejudice	Preconceived opinion that is not based on reason or actual experience.
Allies	The group of countries that fought against the Axis (these include Great Britain, France, USA, China)
Axia	The group of countries that fought against the Allies (these include Germany, Italy, Japan)
holocaust	A destruction or slaughter on a mass scale.
evacuation	When you are forced to leave a place.
evacuee	A person who has been evacuated from a place of danger.
Luftwaffe	The German air force
R.A.F	The British air force. Royal Air Force (R.A.F)
Propaganda	Information, especially of a biased or misleading nature, used to promote a political cause.
heroic	Having the characteristics of a hero or heroine

ART. DESIGN & TECHNOLOGY

In art, the children will be critiquing and appraising the work of Henry Moore. They will be using sketching to recreate his famous wartime sketches of Anderson Shelters. In DT, they will make Anderson Shelters, using a range of DT skills.

GEOGRAPHY

The children will use a map of Europe from 1939 and N. America to identify Allied and Axis countries. The children will then compare with the old map with a present day political map of the Northern Hemisphere and discuss what has changed.

HISTORY
