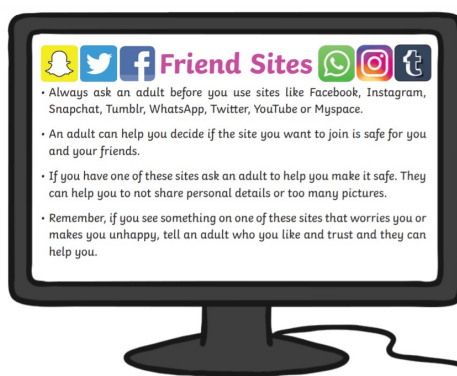
Reading aloud with your child, just **10 minutes** a day, is one of the best ways to provide learning tools for life

WINTER DISCO—Y1-6

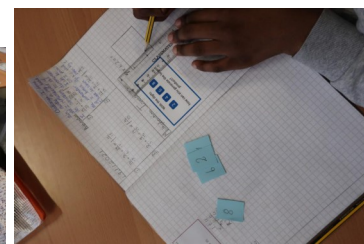
THURSDAY 16th DECEMBER

SYCAMORE MATHS

Year 6 have been learning how to position digits within a 4 digit multiplication calculation and how this affects the size of the product generated. Given the digits- 2, 4, 6 and 8—they needed to find the biggest product that would come from a two digit number multiplied by a two digit number. They then tested their theory and attempted to discover a generalised rule. Well done Sycamore—keep up the amazing maths problem solving.

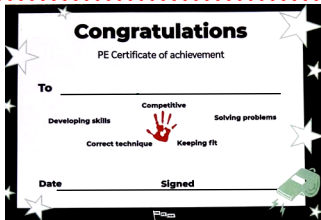
